WOMEN EMPOWERMENT AND NATIONAL DEVELOPMENT

Emphasizing the key role the women empowerment plays in development former UN Director General Dr. Kofi Annan states, "There is no tool for development more effective than the empowerment of women". But for sure the goal of women empowerment remains unachievable if the rights of women go unrecognized. Founder and President of Women's Learning Partnership and women's rights activist of Iran Dr. Mehnaz Afkhami believes "Women's empowerment is intertwined with respect for human rights."

Despite the general agreement on the need and importance of women empowerment, there is exists a fundamental difference in the understanding of this concept between the western and Indian context. Hence, the essential distinction is situating women empowerment in national development. The western notion of women empowerment is ethnocentric, intrinsically psychologistic, structural and elitist, treats women as homogenous structure and undifferentiated mass. While, the Indian model is more inclusive in nature and empathizes family values. Thus, women empowerment entails a different approach in national development in the Indian context.

We at Alhikmah not only strongly believe but also are actively engaged in empowering women while underlining the integrity and supremacy of a closely knit family system. To us it appears to be the only and sure shot formula of development of our beloved nation.

BOOK RELEASE FUNCTION AT INTERNATIONAL BOOK FAIR

Former Union Minister Prof. Sanjay Paswan released the book titled Religious Teachings on Social

Issues on January 13, 2013 at the International Book Fair being held at Pragati Maidan in New Delhi. Speaking on the occasion he said, "The context of the book is extremely important. What is the difference in all religions? The essence of all religions is same". He termed Bhagwad Gita as a "fountainhead of knowledge". According to him, "The person who strives in the pursuit of knowledge actually trades the Divine Path". Hence he emphasized, "We must strive for excellence and leave rest at the Almighty". In his views, "Writing a book is fundamentally a religious service". He appealed to come together to save Planet Earth and make it a better place to live in.

The book is compiled by Alhikmah Foundation and it contains Foreword by Mr. Sirajuddin Qureshi, President India Islamic Cultural Centre and a total of 41 articles spread across eight sections. The contributors are the authentic voices of their respective religions who command respect in the society. Some of the important authors include Maualana Waheeduddin Khan, Father Dominic Emmanuel, Dr. Zafarul Islam Khan, Prof. Saud Alam Qasmi, Swami Shantananda.

The Book brings together commentaries from the authorities of Indic as well as Semitic religions. The Book, to all intents and purposes, offers solutions in the light of Holy Scriptures of the major religions to our daily social life issues such as *Knowledge, Interfaith Partnership, Coexistence and Tolerance, Communal Harmony, Peace, Cleanliness, Serving Humanity and Materialism.*

Speaking on the occasion Chairman of Alhikmah Foundation Dr. Ziauddin Nadwi shed a detailed light on the aims and objectives of Alhikmah Foundation. "It is perpetually engaged in selfless service to the nation since 1990. Our core areas include Health, Education and General Welfare". Tolerance, respect for fundamental human rights, freedom of religion, respect for the rule of law and kindness are among the factors that ensure peaceful coexistence in our homes, schools, institutions, communities and the nation as a whole.

One of the contributors of the book Prof. Anjani Kumar Jha stressed, "The essence of religions is non-violence. Religion is a liberating force that drives us out of ignorance, illiteracy, darkness and other such vices. Guest of Honour Mr. Sirajuddin Qureshi expressed his pleasure at the release of the book. The President of India Islamic Cultural Centre congratulated Alhikmah Foundation for bringing out this important book. "PM's slogan Sabka Sath Sabka Vikas is deeply embedded in our religious traditions. Religion is a key to our national progress and development." He disclosed, "The hon'ble Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modiji, during one of my meetings with him, emphasized the need to seek solutions to our social issues within religious framework. 
Ms. Rehana Ali, Convenor Ladies Wing of Alhikmah Foundation welcomes the guests

REPUBLIC DAY MUSHAIRA AT ALHIKMAH FOUNDATION


